“Rise Up” - 2017 Honor Card

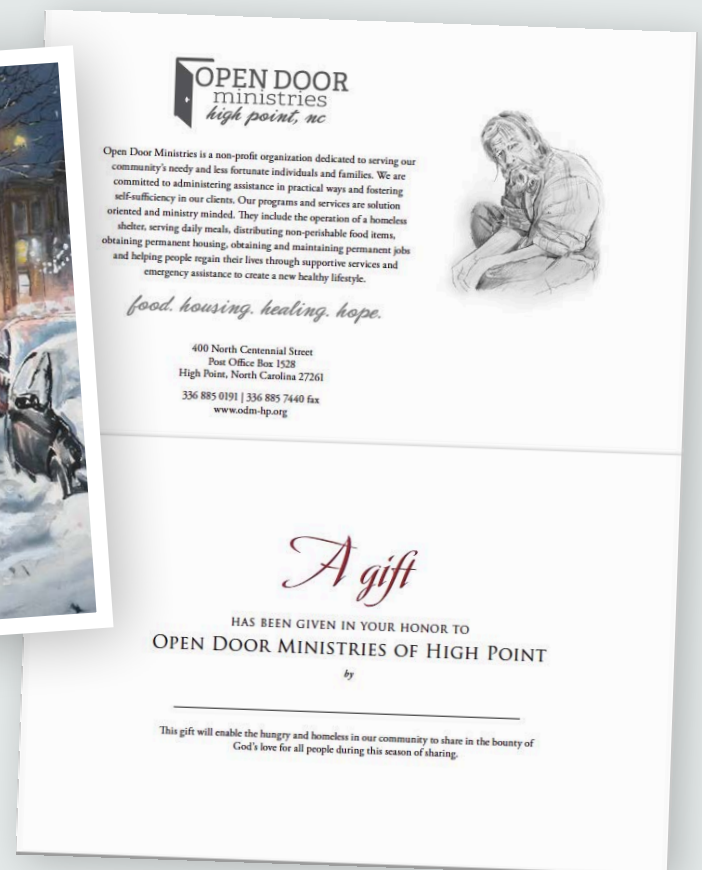
